ANNEXURE-II

Schedule-II

Management of Municipal Solid Waste

1. Collection of Municipal Solid Wastes:

In Mizoram, the 'Mizoram Municipality Bill 2007' was passed by the State Assembly. However, municipalities are not yet formed and so municipality type of administration is not yet adopted. The State Election Commission is planning to hold municipal election soon and process is already underway. At the time being, solid waste management is handled by State Urban Development & Poverty Alleviation Department (UD&PA) and Trade & Commerce Department.

The UD&PA Department practice house to house collection of wastes on regular timings and scheduling by using bell ringing of musical vehicle on daily basis.

Trade and Commerce Department separately collect wastes from market places by placing several RCC bins in 5 (five) markets in the city.

Besides the above, many local communities under the aegis of the Young Mizo Association, practice collection of waste by levying transportation fees from the households.

The bio-medical wastes, though many of them are treated as per the bio-medical waste rules, a large quantity of them are still mixed with the municipal solid waste. The quantity, however seems to decline due to awareness programmes and interactions with the Health Care Facilities.

2. Segregation of Municipal Solid Wastes:

Wastes are not segregated at any point. All the wastes are collectively collected at the point of generation and simply dumped at the dumping place.

3. Storage of Municipal Solid Wastes:

Under the UD&PA management, no storage facilities for municipal solid waste are established. Wastes collected are directly transported to the place of disposal.

The Trade & Commerce Department place several RCC bins at several markets like New Market, Bawngkawn Market, Vaivakawn Market, Mission Veng Market and Ramhlun Market.



4. Transportation of Municipal Solid Wastes:

Wastes are transported by means of truck vehicle, which are not specially designed but are covered. At present 18 trucks are available under UD&PA Department.

The Trade & Commerce Department select contractors who uses trucks and minitrucks for transportation.

5. Processing of Municipal Solid Wastes:

Scientific technologies are not yet adopted for processing wastes and so wastes are not processed in any manner at present. They are simply collected and then dumped at the dumping places.

6. Disposal of Municipal Solid Wastes:

Landfilling System is not yet adopted. The present system of disposal of solid waste is "open dumping" at the dumping ground prepared by LAD.

Under the TFC assistance for solid waste management at Aizawl, implementation has been done by the state UD&PA Department and they started development of disposal site at Tuirial.

ANNEXURE-III

Schedule-III

Specifications for Landfill Sites

There is no existing landfill site at present. Hence, the Mizoram Pollution Control Board initiated a joint identification of new site on the 3rd Sept, 2002, which is about 35kms from Aizawl City for the management and disposal of solid waste in Aizawl City as proposed by the then Local Administration Department (now UD&PA) which is the Municipal Authority for the management of Municipal Solid Waste. The proposed site is away from the habitation clusters, forest areas, monuments, water bodies, National Parks, Wetlands and places of important cultural, historical or religions interest and is away from airport including airbase.

The inspecting team, consisting of representatives from all the concerned departments, after careful examination and discussion, recommended that the proposed site was agreeable and might be developed and processed for scientific management and disposal of Solid Waste. Possession of the land and preparation of project report are still under process.

ANNEXURE-IV

Schedule-IV

Standards for Composting, Treated Leachates and Incineration

The waste processing or disposal facilities including composting, incineration, pelletisation, energy recovery or any other facility based on the art-of-the-state technology are not yet adopted. However, the concerned Department is taking up necessary actions to adopt a more suitable technology. DPR for compost plant is under preparation by the UD&PA Department through the State Investment Programme Implementation Unit (SIPMIU).

In the meantime, the Mizoram Pollution Control Board has objected the site selected by the Trade & Commerce Department as it is within 15 km radial distance from Lengpui Airport.
